



HEMP PRODUCTION IN NEW MEXICO

New Mexico has long been an agricultural industry powerhouse; excelling at farming, ranching, and value-added food production. It's poised to become the leader in the world's newest and most significant agricultural boom; the explosive rise in demand for hemp. In 2018 the domestic industrial hemp market was approximately \$800 million and by 2022 it's projected to reach, or even exceed, \$22 billion, and New Mexico is ideally positioned to help you be part of that massive market growth.



Government Support: New Mexico's government officials are supportive of the growing hemp industry and are accessible, providing constant guidance on policies and actively seeking industry collaboration. New legislation was signed in April of 2019 giving hemp producers a statewide framework for growing the plants, and the state is working hand-in-hand with hemp industry companies and farmers as they develop specific policies; ensuring that the regulatory environment is tailored to their needs.



Ideal Growing Conditions: With an average of 300+ days of sunshine per year across the state, a mild climate with warm days and cool nights, and a state full of well-draining soil, New Mexico's climate is ideal for hemp. Access to water in New Mexico is abundant, with the Rio Grande and connected irrigation network running throughout the state.



Talent: New Mexico has varied labor pools throughout the state, giving companies access to all the talent they need. Our universities have developed hemp and agricultural related curriculum, producing entry level talent in the field. The state also has a significant experienced talent pool to draw from, given our large value-added agriculture industry. Whether your focus is farming of hemp, production of fiber-based materials, or extraction of chemical components such as CBDs, or all of the above, the state has the talent with the expertise you need to implement the best methodologies available today, or to innovate new solutions for the future.



Strategically Located: Supported by three interstate freeways, a vast railway system, and one of the fastest border crossings with Mexico, New Mexico offers fast access to the populations of the United States, Canada, and Mexico. Rail connections direct to LA/Long Beach and Houston/Galveston ensure that the rest of the world is at your fingertips as well. This gives New Mexico an ideal location when it comes to importing biomass or distributing finished products.
