

LOS LUNAS DATA CENTER - THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 7, 2019

In 2016, we broke ground and began constructing Facebook's Los Lunas Data Center. Today, we are thrilled to announce it has begun serving traffic and is now an important part of our global network of hyper-efficient data centers. These buildings, and the hardware inside them, will help people stay connected with friends and family, discover what's going on in the world, and share and express what matters to them.

While our construction will continue through 2023, we have two data halls up and running. So far, we have poured over 128,000 cubic yards of concrete, used 14,600 tons of steel and laid 4,572 miles of wire. Every day, an average of more than 1,100 workers have been on-site.

Last year, we announced we are reducing our greenhouse gas emissions by 75 percent by 2020. Right here in New Mexico, we have also been working on implementing industry-leading sustainable practices that minimize the impact of our energy, emissions and water usage. For example, we were proud to work with the Public Service Company of New Mexico and leading developers to bolster New Mexico's renewable energy market. In fact, the American Wind Energy Association recognized the impact of our commitment to renewable energy in helping states like New Mexico harness more of their wind energy resources. The wind farms developed to support Facebook's Los Lunas Data Center contributed to New Mexico adding wind power at a faster rate than any other state in 2017. As of today, we have signed commitments that will add more than 396 megawatts of new wind and solar resources to the New Mexico electric grid. We anticipate these eight projects will result in an investment of over \$800 million and 1,300 jobs throughout the state.

Our data centers, including the Los Lunas Data Center, are 80 percent more water efficient than the average. But here in New Mexico, we took our water stewardship further by partnering with the local community to restore the wetlands and stream to the Comanche Creek area in Northern New Mexico. This restoration will lead to continued increase in water quantity and quality, enhanced habitats, and improved foraging for both wildlife and livestock. As our construction continues, we will continue to work with the community to find additional ways to restore water to the area.

When we selected Los Lunas, we committed to creating a positive impact in the community and investing in the long-term vitality of Valencia County and its residents. In a couple of weeks, we will award our first Community Action Grants for projects and organizations based in the county. These grants aim to support organizations and initiatives that help to connect the community and increase digital skills.

We are thrilled to have made New Mexico, and specifically Los Lunas, our new home. We appreciate the help and support of our partners in the community and look forward to continuing our strong partnership!
